

The next CIHC full newsletter will be mailed out in early April, but we wanted to send a message to all our members and supporters to share important news. The City of **Brantford** and the development company **Terrasan** are one step closer to concluding a deal for the remediation and redevelopment of the **Greenwich-Mohawk** site in Brantford, which includes the planned future home of the Canadian Industrial Heritage Centre in the **1903 Cockshutt Plow Company Office** building. After 19 months of negotiations, Brantford and Terrasan have put together a draft agreement. The City of Brantford is holding a series of public consultations about the plans for the site, and hope to bring the draft agreement to city council for signing by the end of March 2011. This is an exciting time for the CIHC as we get closer to our dream of establishing a physical site in Brantford to preserve and promote our industrial heritage.
