The City finally completing the tax sale on 66 Mohawk and after some delay finally vesting in the property. They are now the official owners of the site.

Demolition has begun on all the other buildings but the Office warehouse and Timekeepers building as they were designated as a heritage site (along with 5 acres) for museum purposes.

our industrial heritage. During this launch 10 dollars from every book sold will go directly to the CIHC project.


Clean Up with Beautiful Brantford















Above, building and grounds before clean up. Below, inside building, years of deterioration revealed.




